Boys and Girl's club of Georgetown: Director Anestee introduced Chair of the Clubs - Dusty Nelems and Program Director Josh Coiraso.

The Georgetown Club Serves 190 Boys and girls during the school year from all income levels. With 150 kids served in the summer. Clubs went through major renovation program April 2010. Through a huge community effort and the coordination of many volunteers and contractors the Club renovation took only one week from demolition to rebuilding. The club is in the planning stages of expansion of a second club on the west side of I35. There is a fee of \$10 per year with scholarships available for those who can not afford the fee. There is no fee for children of active military personnel. Annual budget is \$240,000. The Club receives an annual funding of \$40,000 from the County. Other grants and contributions make up 55% of the annual budget with 45% coming from community donations. The club provides different programming, including video games, air hockey, study hall, counseling, meals for qualifying families.

Director Anstee took the Rotary Club on a tour of the facility which was very spacious along with some computer area.

The program on April 5, 2011 was presented by Brian Harvey, Director of Capital Campaign for Scott & White Healthcare. Brian stated that S & W was the largest healthcare provider in Texas, They had over 1,000 physician providers, 12 hospitals, and 60 clinics. A new Children's Hospital would be opening this fall in Temple. S & W has over 2 million patient visits per year and a new expansion is now beginning on the Round Rock facilities.

As VP of Development, Brian looks for support of charity for S & W, and explained what to do if you would like to will an estate to S & W. Brian takes care of the investment of the endowment fund to help support scholarships for medical students. He stated also that land can be given through the charitable trust.

Susan Ferguson then spoke about the Legacy Gifts Program. She stated that there were 2 levels of Legacy Gifts, Lifetime level for cumulative gifts of \$10,000 or more and annual for cumulative gifts of \$1,000 or more. She also went on to explain the many benefits that Legacy Guests receive.
