Doug's talk centered on his involvement with The Palace Theater in Georgetown. He discussed three main purposes of The Palace: 1) to provide the town with a community theater, 2) to offer programs for children to learn to sing and act, and 3) to maintain the historical preservation of the downtown.

When the theater was in financial straits about four years ago, his expertise helped to prevent its closing. Hiring new staff and putting on productions supported by the community has helped to bring in larger audiences.
