Last Week: by **Gary Sandercock**

Gary requested Juancho Tabangay, Director of Engineered Cryogenic System Sales to make the cryogenic presentation. Juancho's office is in San Jose, CA. He has global responsibility for these sales that are accomplished using a global sales force and strategically located Channel Partners around the world. Usually people only associate cryogenics with freezing people. However, the purpose of this presentation was to educate people how cryogenics can touch your life everyday and you'll not be aware of it.

The cryogenics business is mostly accomplished using liquid nitrogen but other gases are used as well. The temperature of liquid nitrogen is -320 ° F and above that temperature the liquid turns to a gas. There are numerous market segments that use liquid nitrogen with the Food and Beverage Industry being the largest business segment. Juancho gave examples of liquid nitrogen dosing of beverages that is used for inerting and pressurizing. Other market segments served are Aerospace, Solar, Electronics, Semiconductor, Automotive, Entertainment, Research & Development, Medical, Pharmaceutical, CryoBio and Defense which represent the largest majority of the business segments served.

Other interesting items were that Juancho will be a US Citizen in the next few months and he was a Rotarian in Manila prior to moving to the USA.

Number of people who will develop a mental illness at some point in their lives. Globally, less than US\$2 per person per year is spent on mental health, according to the WHO's 2011 Mental Health Atlas. Nearly half the world's population lives in a country that has, on average, no more than one psychiatrist per 200,000 people.

Bivalent oral vaccine

Until 2009, India accounted for nearly half the number of the world's polio cases. A chief factor in the country's success has been the widespread use of the bivalent oral polio vaccine, which is effective against both remaining types of the poliovirus. Another has been rigorous monitoring, which has helped reduce the number of children missed by health workers during National Immunization Days to less than 1 percent, according to WHO.

Rotary International has played a major role in helping to stop the transmission of polio in India. Rotary has been a spearheading partner in the Global Polio Eradication Initiative since 1988, along with WHO, UNICEF, and the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention. The Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation is also a key supporter of the initiative.

Sporting their signature yellow vests and caps, the nearly 119,000 Rotarians in India have helped administer vaccine to children, organize free health camps and polio awareness rallies, and distribute banners, caps, comic books, and other items.

Double Foundation Recognition Points for Recurring Contributions 1 April – 1 July 2012

How do I sign up for a recurring gift (Rotary Direct) online?

Once you are registered for Member Access, you can contribute at www.rotary.org/contribute. Please note that Rotary's online system can accommodate one-time or recurring contributions, and is available in 12 currencies. The recurring option is presented in Step 2 of the contribution process under the section titled "Frequency". Donors may also enroll using [The Rotary Foundation Contribution Form \(123\)](#), by selecting "Make this a recurring contribution". How do I register for Member Access?

On the www.rotary.org homepage, click the [Member Access](#) button in the top right corner,



Reach Within to Embrace Humanity

then click [Register Now](#) to create an account with a valid e-mail address. You may be asked to provide additional information to help determine your relationship with Rotary and access your record. You will receive a verification e-mail with a hyperlink within 24 hours. You must click on the verification link to complete the registration process. If you do not see the e-mail in your Inbox, check your Spam/Bulk/Junk folder.

What is the Annual Fund?

Your support of the Annual Fund is the key to serving communities worldwide in Rotary's areas of focus. You can direct your Annual Fund gift to *SHARE*, the World Fund, or an area of focus fund. **SHARE** is the primary source of funding for Rotary Foundation programs. It's also the only Annual Fund designation that generates funding for the District Designated Fund. Rotary districts use their DDF to support Foundation activities both locally and internationally.

Is there a minimum contribution amount?

Due to the processing fees associated with credit card contributions, a minimum contribution of US\$10 or more per scheduled transaction (i.e. \$10 per month) is required. One-time contributions, while greatly appreciated, are not eligible for the promotional double Foundation recognition point match.

When will I receive my double recognition points?

Each scheduled recurring gift that is made between 1 April and 1 July will automatically receive double Foundation recognition points at the time each individual contribution is processed. If a donor is enrolled to give monthly, each monthly transaction would result in a double amount of Foundation recognition points.

Can I enroll using a checking account (direct debit) arrangement?

Individuals can enroll in Rotary's recurring giving program by using either a credit card or a debit card. Available card types vary depending on the country and currency in which you contribute.

Can a club treasurer donate online for an entire club?

Online contributions cannot be made on behalf of another individual, club, or district. Each individual will have to personally contribute online and specify a frequency of 'monthly', 'quarterly' or 'annually'. Donors may also enroll by completing [The Rotary Foundation Contribution Form \(123\)](#) and selecting "Make this a recurring contribution".

Why is this promotion only for Rotary Direct contributions?

The goal is to encourage ongoing support of Rotary's humanitarian and educational activities. Rotary's new online contribution system can accommodate giving on a regular basis to further the mission of The Rotary Foundation. Online and recurring gifts are the most secure for donors and most cost-effective way for Rotary to process contributions, enabling even more support for grants, scholarships and vocational training teams.

What are the frequency options available for Rotary Direct gifts?

If you choose to make a recurring contribution, you will be registering to make a gift every month, quarter, or year on the 1st of the month. Note: Processing of quarterly donations occurs in July, October, January, and April. For annual contributions, you may choose the processing month.

How do I change my method of payment, amount or stop Rotary Direct contributions?

To make any changes to your account, please contact your local Rotary International

Office that services your area or Rotary's Contact Center at 1-866-976-8279. For security reasons, please notify us by telephone if you wish to change or update your credit card information.

What amount is credited toward my club's Annual Giving goal?

The actual contribution amount(s) designated to the [Annual Fund](#) will count toward a club's annual giving goal and per capita. April, May and June scheduled contributions will be credited toward the club and district's 2011-12 annual giving goals and per capita achievements. July Rotary Direct contributions will be credited to the 2012-13 Rotary year.

If I am US\$500 away from reaching Paul Harris Fellow status, will a recurring contribution of \$250 make me eligible for Paul Harris Fellow?

Although you will receive double Foundation recognition points for your recurring contributions between 1 April and 1 July, you will not earn double recognition amount toward your own Paul Harris Fellow status. The double points earned may only be used to name others a Paul Harris Fellow or Multiple Paul Harris Fellow.

What are Foundation recognition points and how are they accumulated?

Foundation recognition points are awarded to donors who contribute to The Rotary Foundation through the [Annual Fund](#) or [PolioPlus](#), or as a sponsor portion to a Foundation grant. Donors receive one Foundation recognition point for every U.S. dollar contributed to these funds. Donors can extend Foundation recognition points to others to help them become or to name them as a Paul Harris Fellow or Multiple Paul Harris Fellow. Points may only be transferred once, and will be reflected in the Paul Harris Fellow recognition amount of the recipient. [Learn more.](#)

Do Foundation recognition points count toward Major Donor recognition?

No. Only cumulative personal outright contributions count toward [Major Donor recognition](#).
