Charley Ray introduced our speaker, Bill Pohl, a real estate broker in Austin. Young Pohl came to Austin in 1951 aged 6, attended Austin public schools and graduated Austin High School in 1964.

Mr. Pohl attended SMU and later transferred to UT and graduated in 1972 with a degree in business. He worked as a real estate salesman for one year while studying to be a real estate broker and in 1973 Mr. Pohl opened his own estate company.

He bought and sold land and also developed real estate such as the Lakeline Mall. His work over the years was extensive whereby borrowing capital, buying land, developing real estate and selling these enterprises became a full time job.

Mr. Pohl was a student of history: many years ago an agent buying real estate was actually purchasing by Barter Note. After many years, a debt system was established. Later on, Alexander Hamilton saved the business world by setting up a tax/interest system and bank/debt for borrowing money. At the beginning, bank would own the real estate. Between 1960 and 1970 Fannie Mae and Freddie Mac were formed and then banks could sell their real estate holdings to these organizations. Many developments in America were picked up by Europeans and were successful there.

The problem in the real estate market today is the result of low down payments, low interest rates, ease of borrowing, and availability of homes. When the bubble burst, foreclosures resulted.
