Sun City Rotary Club, Georgetown Fire Department and Georgetown Independent School District are pleased to recognize and "THANK" all the 2022 "Breakfast with Santa" (BWS) sponsors, donors and volunteers who continue to make this community-wide project possible (22nd year for BWS). Fortunately, we were able to resume our traditional pancake and sausage breakfast prepared by Georgetown Firemen as well as the Santa photos. BWS for the previous two years was a "drive-by" event to wave at Santa and then receive a "goodie bag." Although those "goodie bags" were good, the 820 people who were served breakfast will probably all agree that a hot plate of Fireman-prepared pancakes and sausage is much, much better!

What remains unchanged is the primary objective of our annual "Breakfast with Santa" project which is helping kids and families in our community and area during the Christmas season. Our focus again this year was to provide food-related assistance rather than shopping for "gifts." Your financial contributions this year made Christmas a lot brighter for fifty-two families with students at Frost Elementary School in Georgetown, dozens of teenagers served by "The NEST" (program managed by The Georgetown Project) plus many more additional kids and families assisted by the Jarrell UMC Food Pantry as well as members of our community served by The Caring Place in Georgetown and the kids that receive weekly food from Backpack Buddies.

Frost Elementary School families, identified and selected by GISD, who accepted the invitation to participate this year, received grocery gift cards to help provide a special family Christmas meal while "NEST" teenagers stockings were stuffed with gift cards for restaurants and movies. The LOCKER Foundation (Georgetown High Schools) received BWS cash and Richarte High School received gift cards to support their programs.

Sun City Rotary Club's 22nd "Breakfast with Santa" outreach has increased from an initial total of 10 children (4 Georgetown families) up to this year's direct and indirect food-related help for over 400 kids. It was wonderful to see the Community Center filled with happy families enjoying a hot breakfast, lots of kids and families getting their picture taken with Santa and guests taking a guided tour of a firetruck as they exited.

"THANKS," again, to everyone who supported the return of a more traditional "Breakfast with Santa."
