The Rotary Club of Ushuaia is in District 4930 which also covers southern Argentina and part of Buenos Aires and has 44 Clubs with only 718 members.

The Club was Chartered in 1987, has 17 Members and its President is Maria Culotta.

The Club is the third most southern Rotary Club in the world - there are two in Antarctica at Spanish speaking stations.

USHUAIA is the southernmost city in world and is_the <u>capital of Tierra del Fuego Province</u>, Argentina.

The city was founded in 1884 by Captain <u>Augusto Lasserre</u> of the Argentinian Navy and is located on the shores of the <u>Beagle Channel</u> surrounded by the mountain range of the <u>Martial Glacier</u>, in the Bay of Ushuaia. Besides being an administrative centre, it is a light industrial port and tourist hub.

In addition to being a vacation destination for local and international tourists, Ushuaia is also the key access point to the <u>Southern Ocean</u>. Its commercial pier is the major port of departure in the world for tourist and scientific expeditions to the <u>Antarctic Peninsula</u>.

<u>Cruise ships</u> visiting the <u>Falkland Islands</u> and <u>Antarctica</u> dock at the port from September to April. Tourists can also visit Cape Horn in Chilean waters by boat.

Guest Speaker – Gwenda Webb

An amazing adventure, a humbling and powerful site. Here were 120 passengers on the vessel. Spanned a 2 week trip from the southern tip of Argentina to the Antartica peninsula. Experienced 18m swells so everything, except passengers are chained to the floor.

Gwenda was in a zodiac when they sited whales.

There is great emphasis on hygiene to prevent contamination of the coastline of Antarctica. Tempranged from -5 to 5oC. Winter gets to -80oC.

The penguins sulk when moulting. On the trip Gwenda saw many and many icebergs.

Visited 3 bases, Chile, Argentina and the Ukraine. There are only a limited number of ship's captains that are authorised to navigate the Sir Francis Drake Chanel.

Gwenda's captain was on duty for 2 month's straight. Drake Passage with 18m swells was a challenge.
