Sunday was the anniversary of the award of the George Cross to the Island of Malta during the Second World War. My Father fought under British command for the Maltese Army against the German and Italian armed forces. My Mother endured tremendous hardship and witnessed horrific scenes as well as the loss of her Mother and Sister during the assault on the island.

In early 1942 Hitler ordered Malta to be neutralized in preparation for a German invasion. The Luftwaffe carried out hundreds of air raids on the island and from January to July 1942 there was only one 24 hour period when no bombs fell on the island.

Malta holds the record for suffering the heaviest sustained bombing attack of WW2, 154 days and nights and 6,700 tons of bombs. During the entire time, the islands population of 270,000 were positive in their refusal to submit.

Food was in extremely short supply and the people of Malta were on the brink of starvation. They spent much of their time in underground shelters and as a result of this health standards declined and malnutrition and sickness became widespread. Medical supplies were also scarce.

In May 1942 Germany prematurely declared that Malta had been neutralized and diverted the Luftwaffe elsewhere. In the brief lull that followed, over 60 RAF Spitfires arrived on the island together with other reinforcements.

The war left the island devastated with over 10,000 buildings damaged or destroyed and the docks at Valletta heavily damaged. Thousands were injured and it took several decades to rebuild the economy.

The George Cross was awarded to the island of Malta on 15 April 1942 by King George VI in recognition of their continuing and heroic struggle against repeated and continuous attacks during World War 2. In his message addressed to the Island's Governor General Sir William Dobbie, King George VI wrote:

"To honor her brave people I award the George Cross to the Island Fortress of Malta to bear witness to a heroism and devotion that will long be famous in history"

In recognition of the anniversary of the George Cross Medal awarded to Malta on 15 April 1942 at Valletta, I would like to acknowledge the Rotary Club of La Vallette and its President, Bryan Sullivan, which was Chartered in April 2002, has 54 members and meets at the Intercontinental Hotel in St Georges Bay, St Juliane. This is one of three Rotary Clubs on the Islands of Malta under District 2110 which also covers the southern part of Italy.

Mark felt he could make a positive contribution and sought to instigate the Dan Vickerman PhD Scholarship through Australian Rotary Health.

Dan was not only an exceptional rugby player, he was also a smart scholar, studying at Sydney Uni and Cambridge.

After a reasonable time Mark explored the opportunities of creating a scholarship to research into mental illness. Sought permission to establish a fundraising program to raise the necessary \$40k. Through rugby connections funds were raised to assist the scholarship.

The fundraising program works on a 1:3 ratio where an extra \$2 are contributed by the raising of \$1 of public funds.
