Cricket loving Members will recognise past players such as Wes Hall, Gary Sobers, Frank Worrell and Joel Garner as West Indies cricketers from the island of **Barbados** at the east edge of the Caribbean.

Barbados is just East of the Windward Islands, that string of islands which run north off South America, curve around the Caribbean Sea to the west ending in Dominica and Cuba.

It was colonised by Portugal from 1532 until 1620 and occupied by Britain in 1625.

Yesterday it celebrated its Independence from the United Kingdom in 1966.

It remains a Member of the Commonwealth and still provides players to West Indies Cricket. The population is around 287 000 and its capital is Bridgetown.

Rotary District 7030 covers 17 countries in the Caribbean and the top of South America. 3 of the 72 Clubs in the District are in Barbados.

The oldest of these is the **Rotary Club** of **Barbados** which was Chartered in 1962 and has 88 very active members led by **President Fiona Hinds**.

At this time last year the Club ran a rock concert with half a dozen bands including an Elton John cover band from England to raise funds for their Schoolhouse for Special Needs Project. The concert is delayed this year for obvious reasons.

Michael acknowledged the indigenous people of the land. He has researched the contribution each club makes and has observed the activities of our Club, including Youth, community and international.

Rotarians contribute 470,000 hours each year. In AUD the work is worth over \$1B. Rotary is in a unique position to be able to assist with distribution of Covid vaccines. This year's logo is "Year of Opportunities". This aligns with the merge of Districts either side of the Hume Highway.

100 years of Rotary - one project is to distribute Cervical Cancer prevention packages across the Pacific.

District 9700 was vulnerable to a merger, however the 2 DG's at the time grasped the initiative and drove the merge process.

A new Rotary area of interest is the 7th, being "The Environment".

There are 4 requests from **RI President Holger Knaack.**

- New and innovative club models eg, Zoom, Mums & Bubs, Passport Clubs, Corporate Clubs.

- 3. Be careful to make sure that new members are a good fit, and are looked after.
