International Toast: Trevor Fair

Spain celebrated its National Day yesterday, being the date in 1492 when Christopher Columbus landed in the Bahamas and claimed the Americas for King Ferdinand and Queen Isabella.

It was also the day on which the Spanish recaptured Granada to complete the *Reconquista* - the reconquest of the southern half of the Iberian Peninsula from the Moors which had lasted 781 years since the Muslim invasion in 711 AD.

Columbus, who was actually Italian sailed from and returned to Palos de la Frontera near Cadiz on the Atlantic south coast in Andalusia. There is no Rotary Club in Palos but there is one in nearby Huelva which was established as a port by the Phoenicians in the 9th Century BC and occupied in turn by the Greeks, Carthaginians, Romans and Visigoths before the Moors.

Today Huelva is a city of 145, 000 served by the **Rotary Club of Huelva** which was Chartered in District 2203 in 1984.

President Andreas Rodriguez leads 15 Members struggling along like much of Europe and especially Spain with the resurgence of the virus. They are still active in providing food parcels to people in need of support during the pandemic.

Ian Scandrett - Councillor on WSC -

Has been on council for 9 years on WSC. Comes from a service background. Parents heavily involved in volunteering, so it was just expected?

Still trying to make a difference. Next election is Sept 2021.

The Station St project commenced with funds from the Port Kembla lease. Was initially the Bowral St Bypass now called Station St Bypass. The main aim is to get vehicles off Bong Bong St (which is the designated road).

The project morphed, and by this term was just a Station St bypass. Original cost was \$9.5m now ballooned to \$15.5m

John Barrett - Friends of Bowral & Friends of Wingecarribee.

Have been able to see, through FOI, the decision making process. One aim is to get Bong Bong St as a Council road. What has transpired is a re-alignment of Station St. RMS has not accepted the change of designated road to Station St as it does not meet current standards.

149 trees are identified for removal. Of special significance are the 8 Oak trees which were planted in 1936 for the coronation of King George VI.

Disappointment is not just Council, but also State Government with land allocation

especially near the train station. Dept of Infrastructure are required to approve of any changes to project.

Friends of Wingecarribee is a new group which has recently formed. Looking to run candidates however is a complicated process. Also looking at the gender imbalance. Looking to coach persons to become Councillors, including the infrastructure and logistics etc.
