The island of **Mauritius** is located about 2 000km east of Africa in the Indian Ocean. It was uninhabited when the Portuguese established the first European settlement in 1507.

It was subsequently colonised by the Dutch in 1638 then the French and was finally taken over by Britain in 1810.

Slaves were imported from west Africa and Madagascar to establish and run the sugar plantations until slavery was abolished in 1835. After that, as in Fiji, the British brought in indentured labour from India to replace the slaves.

The country established its own constitution and self government on 12th March, 1968 and the Republic of Mauritius celebrated its Independence Day on 12th March 1992. It is a member of the Commonwealth of Nations.

Today it is a nation of 1¼ million people with a rich mix of history and ethnic heritage with English, French and Mauritian Creole the official languages. Sugar and tourism underpin the economy.

The **Rotary Club of Riviere-Noire** or Black River meets at Big Willy's Restaurant in Tamarin on the south west coast about 50km south of the capital Port Louis.

It was Chartered in 1991 in District 9220 which covers island states in the West Indian Ocean and its 15 Members are led by **President Ajagakumaren Ramsamy.**

In recognition of the Independence Day of the Republic of Mauritius would you please be upstanding and toast the President and Members of the Rotary Club of Black River.
