Zimbabwe celebrated its Independence Day last Sunday marking 41 years since independence. In the succeeding years it has struggled under the Mugabe government and is only now starting to recover since his death in 2019.

It was colonised by the British South Africa Company in 1840. In its short history, the Country went from selfgoverning colony in 1923, to the African Federation Central with Northern Rhodesia and Nyasaland, 1953 to 1963, back to self governing colony Rhodesia when as Independence was granted to the other two countries renamed Zambia and Malawi, to an independent Rhodesia following the Unilateral Declaration of Independence from

Britain by the predominately white government of Ian Smith.

15 years of civil war followed. The war ended in 1980 when the Country was renamed Zimbabwe and independence was established under an African Nationalist government.

Bulawayo is the second largest city in Zimbabwe with 1.2 million residents. It was a significant manufacturing town but over the years much of the expertise and skills left for safer places and manufacturing has declined.

Still serving the people of the city is the Rotary Club of Bulawayo, Chartered in 1931 in District 9210 which also covers Malawi, Mozambique and Zambia.

President Sithenjisiwe Masiya leads 21 Members who are busy providing support to the poor of the city.

In recognition of the Independence Day of Zimbabwe and the continuing life struggles of its people, would you please raise your glasses and toast the President and Members of the Rotary Club of Bulawayo.
