The Seleucid Empire of Syria extended from south Turkey to Persia and Afghanistan and included Palestine in the second century BC.

In 164 BC, in response to defiling of their temple by a politically appointed high priest the Maccabean Jews rioted and regained control of the city of Jerusalem from the Seleucids.

The Jewish festival of **Hanukkah**, the **Festival of Lights** starts at sundown on Thursday, 10th December and runs until sundown on 18th in celebration of that event.

The rituals include lighting of each of the nine candles of a menora, one more each night until on the last night they are all lit. The belief is that the lamps in the rededicated Temple of David burned for 9 days even though there was only enough oil in each lamp for one day.

The City of Jerusalem now-a-days has $1\frac{1}{4}$ million residents and of course it is the centre of constant tension – nothing has changed in $2\frac{1}{2}$ thousand years or more.

The **Rotary Club of Jerusalem** is the nearest to the Temple. It was Chartered in 1929 in District 2490 and has 22 Members led by **President Dieter Ziulkowski**.

They are still meeting by Zoom and like us, their activities lately have been limited by the pandemic.

Would you please raise your glasses in recognition of the Jewish Festival of Hanukkah and make our International Toast to the President and Members of the Rotary Club of Jerusalem.
