The Southern Highlands Branch was completed in April 2018. Part of the original Moss Vale Police Station is underground. There are still some original Cells.

There are between 68-69 people employed at the Station:

Highway Patrol Administration Domestic Violence Support Youth Liaison Police Prosecutors

The Area Command incorporates Moss Vale, Bowral, Mittagong, Goulburn, Yass, Crookwell to Young.

Downstairs is the Front Counter, Booking Area, Charge Room, Cells, Finger Printing, Breath Testing, 2 Interview Rooms.

Upstairs is the Detectives, Highway Patrol, Administration, Police Prosecutors, Counselors,



Gwenda Webb asked : "Was there a shower in the Cells?" Rosemary Kelly replied: "You mean an ensuite" Gwenda said, "Yes" Rosemary replied " Haven't you heard "Don't drop the soap".

The Interview Room has a Video and CD Recorder. There are 3 CD copies – One for the person interviewed, one for the Police, one master copy which is stored.

40-50% are DNA tested. If this is refused a Court Order is sought for a hair sample.

Examples of crimes are Drugs, Break and Enter, Assaults, Mental Health. The biggest crimes are Domestic Violence.

They work in 2 shifts. There are 2 Female Officers – 1 in Robertson and 1 in Bundanoon.

Goulburn has a higher instance of Crimes and therefore more Police. Also regular bashings inside Goulburn Gaol. Young has a similar crime rate to the Moss Vale area. Southern Highlands is a low rate crime area.

We then all went upstairs after spending time in the downstairs area. We passed a lot of Officers at their desks, as it was shift changeover time.

Since September our Area Command is o standby for Bush Fires. We are in a high fire danger area.

Our Area Command Highway Patrol has 17 Officers. 5 Cars with 3 more coming. A Silver BMW is being tested at the moment for our area. An anecdote from Sergeant Matt:

Opposite the Highway Patrol Area there is a wet area for Umbrellas, etc. "it is not a Urinal as it looks".

We then went into the Meeting Room where there was a huge Television Screen and Seating.

Matt showed us photographs of an Accident that morning between Trucks on the Church Street Overpass. It occurred at 4.47am and they were there are 5.10am. It took over 3 hours for the fire to be controlled.

He then asked for a volunteer – Gwenda Webb – and put her in a Police Vest. It has the same equipment as worn on the Police Belt, which weighs over 5 kilos.

It includes a Body Video Camera.

The Video reads the veins in the Officer's hands before it records. It produces an on-line record of incidents. It has 18 hours battery life. It makes Officers and the Public behave better. It makes incidents far more successful for the Courts. There are more early Guilty Pleas when the Video is produced.

lan Langford then tried on the Vest and tested the Taser.

There is a high incidence of fraud scams in our area as we are "Law Abiding Citizens".

David Rees then commented that the Police Department was like Teachers – Matt replied "But we are Shift Workers".



We all thanked Matt once again for his excellent Presentation and departed for Dinner/Drinks at the Moss Vale Hotel – The Pink Hotel.
