Sunday was the anniversary of the revolution in 1911 which overthrew the last Emperor of the Qing Dynasty of China and saw the establishment of the Republic of China.



Puyi, China's Last Emperor

Han Chinese settled in Formosa in the 17th Century under a Dutch Colony and the Qing annexed the island in 1683. They ceded the island to Japan in 1895 and the Republic of China took it back after the Second World War.

When the Republic lost the civil war to the communists in 1949 they retreated to Formosa and established Taiwan which grew as an economic miracle to be the wealthy democracy it is today. They still celebrate 10th October as their National Day and claim to be the legitimate rulers of the whole of China.

Their neighbours disagree so they currently live a very precarious existence.

Taiwan has a population of 23½ million and its capital is Taipei on the north coast. 40km to the west is Taoyuan City, a manufacturing and electronics centre home to 2½ million people.



Taoyuan means Peach Garden, a reference to the peach orchards which used to grow there.

The city is served by **The Rotary Club Ping Chen Chung Feng** Chartered in District 3501 in 2007. It has 41 Members led by **President Hsin-Hsiang Chen.**

Like us their activities have been limited lately but they usually support the Global Youth Exchange Program and conduct a community marathon event as a fund raiser.

Rose Conley introduced Mark. Thank you Rose for referring Mark as a Guest Speaker.


Here is Mark's Bio:

Mark Balla is the Immediate Past President of the Rotary Club of Box Hill Central and an Assistant Governor under DG Daryl Moran. He is also Vice Chair of the WASH Rotary Action Group (formerly known as WASRAG) and a member of the Rotary Foundation Cadre of Technical Advisors.

He joined Box Hill Central in March 2014 bringing a small but significant project with him. Mark will tell us about this project and others that have developed since.

In the seven and a bit years since joining Rotary, Mark has attended Rotary International Conventions in Brazil, South Korea, Canada and Germany and spoken at side events at all of these. He has also presented at 14 Rotary District Conferences in Australia, the USA and India.



Over 1 million schools in India without toilets

During a business trip to India, Mark made an unexpected discovery, a discovery that was to turn his understanding of our world upside down. He was so shaken by what he learned that he felt unable to simply walk away.

There were no Toilets in Schools for Teenage Girls.

He met:

Jack Sim - Mr Toilet

Bindeshwar Pathak – Grand Old Man of the Toilet

The Poop Guy - Swapnil Chat

"We Can't Wait" was then established to put Toilets in Schools. For example some Schools with 800 Kids had 2 Toilets. Girls attending Schools dropped by 20-25%. Teachers would catch a Bus to work, and not go to the Toilet all day in the Indian Heat.

Mark showed us a Video of a Toilet Block in a School, which was heart breaking.

In 2019 the Rotary Foundation granted \$1,000,000 to "We can't wait".

If Students wanted to go to the Toilet they would raise a finger. The Foundation Grant has benefited 120,000 kids, and Girls have returned to learning.

Mark's talk was so inspirational, and we thank him so much for talking to, and meeting our Members. Many Members then asked questions, and thanked Mark.

Brian Ritson donated a Brass Statue of Don Bradman for Mark to take to India and raise funds. Also other items he has. He will talk to Mark off-line.

Leigh Robinson will contact Mark off-line regarding our Rotary Foundation Ball in early 2022.
