**Colombia** is located at the northwest corner of South America next to the Isthmus of Panama. It was invaded, conquered and ruled by Spain in 1499 until the territories which are now Colombia, Panama, Venezuela and Ecuador **declared independence on 20th July, 1810**.

It took another 9 years of internal struggle and resistance against Spain before the legendary General Simon Bolivar led the revolution which finally established these territories as an independent federation.

# Tomorrow, the people of Colombia celebrate their Independence Day.

Today, despite many years of political instability and drug cartels Colombia has a relatively high standard of living, functioning democracy, and stable economy.

**Cartagena** is a city of 915 000 on the north coast of the Caribbean Sea. It was the site a series of battles in 1810 between the Spanish and the local

descendants of settlers, slaves and Indians which later led to the retreat of Spain from South America. **The Rotary Club of Cartagena** was Chartered in 1930



in District 4271 and has 41 Members who recently provided laparoscopy equipment to their hospital which has enabled it to offer surgery to people from Colombia and other neighbouring countries.

The Club is led by President Rafael Espana. In celebration of the Independence Day of Colombia would you please be upstanding and make our International Toast to the President and Members of the Rotary Club of Cartagena.

#### Speaker: Lucy Earl – Uniting Church Kitchen



Lucy was introduced by Trevor fair. She is married to Michael, the Uniting Church minister in Bowral. For the past four years Lucy has been the Mission Development Worker at Bowral/Mittagong Uniting Church and prior to this, worked in various community and international development roles for non-Government Organisations such as Uniting World (the international development agency for the Uniting Church in Australia).



#### **President's Corner**

Our meeting this week was rather small, mainly due to all the grey nomads remaining in northern climes and there were more apologies than those present. However, I look forward to the return of the fortunate travellers in the coming weeks. The reinstated Food Basket for distribution by the Uniting Church proved to be a major success and on behalf of the recipients I say, Thank You! An important item for consideration by the Club and for each of us as Members is the issue of Regionalisation as proposed by the Zone 8 special committee. It is incumbent on each of us to familiarise ourselves with the proposal as we will need to vote on it in September. I ask that each of you read the information sheets that have been sent to you by the zone committee.

**Lucy Earl** started by explaining that the Church has a community emphasis stressing both 'Word' and 'Deed'.

It provides food for 55-60 people each week which is collected by Ozharvest from donations by supermarkets, restaurants, and other generous donors. The Church changed to takeaway during Covid lockdowns but are now back to in-house meals. It also delivered 16,000 nonperishable items last year. There are many in need in the Southern Highlands. All food is donated, and operating costs are covered by Council grants and generous donors.

A new shower room/laundry was opened last year for those in need and is well-used. The Church works closely with schools, particularly Bowral Primary, where it has been running a breakfast club offering toast and Milo five days a week.

There is also close co-operation with St Vincent de Paul, Anglicare, and other charitable groups in the Highlands. Although there is considerable wealth in the area, with median rents around \$600pw, there are many facing poverty. The Church cannot pay their bills, but it can feed them and give community support.

Rose Conley thanked Lucy for her talk conveying the Club's appreciation for the Church's work in the Community.
