International Toast- given by Rosemary Kelly

Last week we toasted the nearest Rotary Club to Balmoral where Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II passed away.

Her mourning and funeral have captured the thoughts and attention of most of the world. She was interred in Saint George's Chapel in Windsor Castle in the early hours of this morning.

Windsor is 35km west of London in Berkshire. It is 10km from Heathrow Airport - right under the flight path. It was settled before William the Conqueror arrived and became a main centrefavoured by the Monarchy from the Middle Ages. The castle was built for Edward III from 1350. Further development of the Chapel in 1390 was supervised with Geoffrey Chaucer, author of Canterbury Tales as Clerk of Works. Henry VIII and Jane Seymour, Charles I, George III and other Monarchs are also buried there.

The college town of Eton is just over the River Thames from Windsor and the Rotary Club of Windsor and Eton is the nearest Club to the Castle.

Guest Speaker - Introduced by Tim Borland



Anatoly Rozenfeld moved to Australia from Ukraine in 1992 and joined the University of Wollongong in 1993 to develop Medical Radiation Physics education and participate in research programs. He is currently a Distinguished Professor of Medical Physics and a Director of Centre for Medical Radiation Physics at University of Wollongong to which he was a founder in 2000. The Medical Radiation Physics program at UOW is largest in Asia – Pacific and accredited by US Accreditation Body CAMPEP one out of three outside of North America.

He is an internationally recognised leader in a field of semiconductor radiation detectors for medical dosimetry in radiation therapy, including particle therapy, and space radiation. He has published more than 400 peer review papers (>10000 citations, *h*-index 51, GS) and holds 18 granted patents on radiation detectors and actively involved with his team in their commercialization including licencing of his inventions (e.g. start up Electrogenics Laboratories Ltd).

Anatoly is an immediate past Chair of the International Solid State Dosimetry Organization, Member of ICRU Committee for Microdosimetry Report preparation;Member of Space Medicine and Life Sciences Advisory Group of Australian Space Agency and Member of National Particle Treatment and Research Centre (NPTRC) Steering Committee. He is a Life Senior Member of IEEE and Fellow of Royal Society NSW.

Prof Anotoly Roszenfeld started by saying he would try to share his memories of Chernobyl.

Radiation is concentrated in milk etc. There are numerous nuclear accidents that the world has not been advised of - Kyshtym 1957. Three Mile Island 1979, similar to Fukashima.

In 1966 B52 bombers collided while carrying nuclear bombs. Palomares Spain.

Hospital spills also occured. A Level 5 spill in Goiania in 1987 where 4 people died.

The talk contained many technical examples that the journalist was unable to consume and therefore document.

Accident at Chenobyl NPP.

A release of radioactive and other gases including volatile elements, noble gases.

After the accident there was a programmed evacuation. Initially there was the emergency response with cleaning vehicles to remove radiation dust. Boron is used to to dilute the radioactive isotopes.

Memories about accident

26 April, 1986 accident destroyed $4^{\rm th}$ reactor and killed 30 people, including 28 from radiation exposure. Later 134 were confirmed with acute radiation effects.



When the accident occurred, firemen attended and as they were unaware that it was a nuclear accident. They were contaminated and 30 people died within 3 months.

Robots were used to assist the clean-up.

One of the issues after the accident was the lack of dosimeters to measure the radiation from soil, grass etc. where it was contaminated.

President Leigh gave the vote of thanks.
