The Philippines was happily existing as independent island sultanates and Hindu kingdoms until Magellan arrived in 1543 and it became a Spanish colony for 350 years. It was ceded to the United States in settlement of the Spanish-American War and became independent of Spain on 12th June, 1898.

They lost the Philippines-American war and became a territory of the USA until the Japanese took it from 1942 until 44. The invasion of the Philippines by Allied forces followed the largest naval battle of the war, possibly in history, the Battle of Leyte Gulf when a US and Australian Navy force put up 300 ships against 70 of the Japanese Navy and destroyed the remaining capital ships of Japan.

At the head of the Leyte Gulf is the City of Tacloban which was a safe harbour for the Japanese. Nowadays it is a city of 250 000 and home to the Rotary Club of Tacloban which was Chartered in District 3860 in 1947.

President Eugene Tan leads 55 Members whose activities have been curtailed like ours this year. They have however undertaken a mangrove restoration project where they got down and wet restoring the native shore protection vegetation around the city's coast.

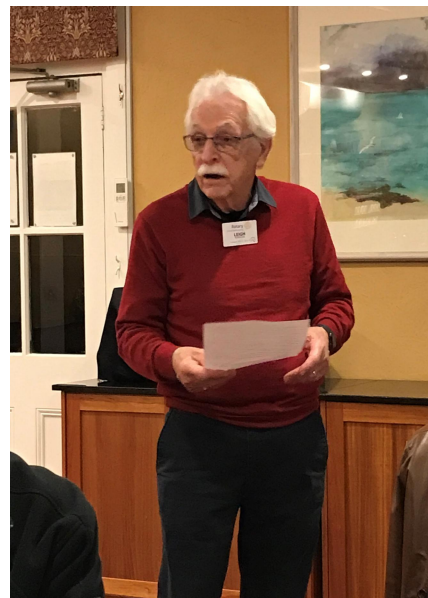

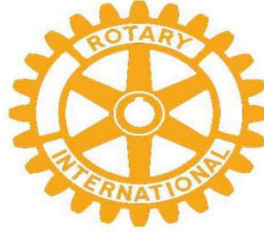


