Haseena said Rotary appealed as an opportunity to 'make a difference' and she stressed the need to look after the members.




Bruce Sutton was the main speaker for the evening. He proposed to speak for 5 minutes about himself and the rest about Rotary.



His great grandfather came

to Australia in the 1890's, his great-grandfather and grandfather were plumbers and his father was the manager at the Maltings in Mittagong until it burnt down! Bruce was born in 1955 at the Strathmore Hospital, near the Bowral Police Station in Wingecarribee St. His mother was a midwife – for Rugby League fans, she delivered Nathen Hindmarsh along with many others. Bruce has 6 children, now aged between 25 and 41.

Bruce trained as an accountant and joined KPMG. He worked with them for 40 years, 10 years in Australia and 30 years in Fiji. Subsequently he set up his own business. He joined the RC Suva East 30 years ago and was president in 1999/2000. When George Speight took over the government in 2000, meetings of more than three people were outlawed. The club did hold a changeover that year in the Australian High Commission but it was almost impossible to continue. Speight is currently in jail for overthrowing the government!



Bruce has since been involved with 'Rotary Pacific Water'. This was started by two members, the head of Vodafone in Fiji and head of a bottled water company. They have \$10 million invested and work on water supply from artesian bores and sanitation. The operation is much more efficient than government as their maximum overheads are 15%. This work is ongoing. Money is not a problem as they are funded by the NZ Aid and others. Rotary is required to raise some relatively small funding per annum but total grants and donations amount to around \$1million per annum.

Luciano Liberale recently travelled to Port Macquarie to celebrate Ian Cropper's 80th birthday. Good to be there but Ian is not in good health.
