## International Toast – Mary Ramsay

Not only is today the traditional birthday of horses but it is the Independence Day of the small African State of Benin.

It was part of the Kingdom of Dahomey which controlled the south coast along the Gulf of Guinea and was influenced by Portugal with its slave trade from the 15th Century until it was colonised by France in 1892 during its acquisition of territory in north west Africa.

Dahomey achieved independence in 1960 with the peaceful constitutional decolonisation of French territories in West Africa and changed its name to Benin in 1975.

The country is now known for the stability of its democracy and has a population of 11 million. Its neighbours are Togo to the west, Burkina Faso and Niger to the north and Nigeria to the east.

Rotary District 9102 covers Benin and Ghana, Niger and Togo along the coast. It has 84 Clubs - 24 of them are in Benin. One of those is the Rotary Club of Cotonou Plage or Cotonou Beach, which serves the largest city, the port of Cotonou.

The Club was chartered in 2015 and has 14 Members led by President Sedo Agbande. They have made a project of providing food and clothing to the House of the Little Sisters of the poor in Tokan, an outer suburb of Cotonou. The house cares for destitute elderly people, many of whom are neglected by their families.

## **Presentation - Challenge House - Rod Aistrope**



Accommodation for parental career transition to group accommodation. The Welby facility provides opportunities for people to gain skillsas well as earn money. The facility has been operating in SH for 18 years. Rod became involved 20 years ago through a community service project.

This Club has built a chicken run, paving etc.

Challenge SH is looking to change its name to Welby Industries. Rod is the current president of Challenge SH. 42 people are employed together with 5 trainers and office staff. Propagation and garden maintenance services are 2 of the main services offered to the general public as well as pallet making, etc and SH Post inserts. NDIS opportunities may assist in expanding services.

Challenge House accessed a grant of \$900k as well as a block of council land.

Opening is scheduled for Sept 2017 - which is possible with great support from local trades and suppliers. Final cost of \$1.7m which was made up with grants together with several local benefactors. Facility of 10 units with tenancy run by ACH. The end plan is to transition tenants to a group house facility.

Caretaker accommodation within the unit is to supervise, not for first aid. 2 crews of gardeners are now operational.
