#### **Presentation - Youth Protection Training**

#### **Speaker: Trevor Fair**



No, Trevor is not being distracted by Pascal's biscuits while speaking, it is just his notes he is reading!

The RI statement of Conduct for Working with Children includes-

"Rotary International strives to create and maintain a safe environment for all youth who participate in Rotary Activities".

To the best of their ability, Rotarians, Rotarian's spouses and partners, and other volunteers must safeguard the children and young people they encounter and protect them from physical, sexual, and emotional abuse.

When in doubt apply the following test-

What would I expect for my child (grandchild)?

Youth protection compliance can be complicated, and different entities/persons interpret and enforce different standards. For example, Dept Education's requirements differ from Rotary's. The Definition as determined by Rotary states the following - Rotary's interpretation of Volunteer when relating to Youth includes Adult involved with a Rotary Youth Program,

- Direct interactions, either supervised or unsupervised,
- Being in a one-on-one situation, or
- Being alone with a young person for a period of time.

"Please do not get stuck on the sexual abuse, also focus on physical and emotional abuse". The policies are created to cover all areas of abuse.

Volunteer definition regarding Youth Protection includes any adult person who might be in a position of being alone with a young person for a period of time.

District 9705 Policy includes the following steps for compliance with Youth Protection Policy.

- A working with Children Check NSW and/or Working with Vulnerable People ACT.
- Complete a Volunteer Information and Declaration Form
- Meet RI and district eligibility requirements for working with youth.

A WWC check is not sufficient, it makes the person eligible to complete the Declaration Form.

Not all club members are required to complete the Volunteer Declaration. Please refer to above definition.

#### **Rotary Insurance Expectations**

- Clubs will provide training (hence tonight's session)
- Molestation Cover has an excess of \$25,000. That is nearly the total balance of our General Account. Ie Member subscriptions would need to include a surcharge to cover the Excess.

#### **Club Compliance**

All Clubs provide annually to District a signed compliance statement - stating that the club is operating its program in accordance with District and RI policies.

Also, confirmation that volunteers will be prohibited from contact with program participants until a written application, interview, reference check and criminal background check have been conducted and clearance for unsupervised contact with program participants has been issued.

Rotary Youth Volunteer Information and Declaration Form

- 1. Personal Details name DoB, contact details.
- 2. Rotary Programs involved with
- 3. Referees -3 with only 1 Rotarian
- 4. Police Check details including WWC Number
- 5. Signed declaration

The Referee check includes suitability for the Volunteer to participate in Rotary Youth Programs

Questions asked may include

• How long have you known the applicant?

- In what capacity do you know them?
- Do you think the applicant is well qualified to work with youth?
- Do you have any reservations / comments in recommending this person for Rotary Youth Programs?

As Club Protection officer I keep a confidential file containing all WWC details and can check a Volunteer's WWC currency with NSW Government. If anyone would like to chat about the WWC process, please feel free to contact me. I can guarantee discretion.

Members may think this is an overkill. However, we have had in recent times a couple of close calls with inappropriate behaviour by Rotarians.

Just remember - What would I expect the duty of care to be for my child / grandchild?
