# International Toast - Louie Liberale

The Philippines was inhabited by pre-human species over 700 000 years ago and by humans for 67 000 years.

It was discovered by Europeans in 1521 when the Portuguese explorer Magellan claimed it for Spain. It was first colonised by the Spaniards in 1561 and ceded to the USA after the Spanish-American War on 12th June in 1898.

So tomorrow Philippinos celebrate their Independence Day from Spain.

On 4th July they will celebrate their independence from America which occurred in 1946 after they recovered the country from Japanese occupation.

Today The Philippines is a vibrant democracy, not always in the way *we* know, with a population of 101 million.

The capital is Manilla but across Manilla Bay in Bataan Province is the industrial and refinery city Limay with 70 000 residents.

The Rotary Club of Limay Bataan was Chartered in 1996 in District 3790 which has 99 Clubs.

President Randy Tallorin leads a young Club of 23 very active Members whose recent achievements include conducting a medical and dental mission and delivering food into poor local villages, facilitating regular public blood donation days and recently they planted 1000 mangroves in a revegetation project.


**Rod Aistrope - International Toast** As Rod will be away for several weeks, seeking some help with the International Toast preparation.

## **Presentation - Bowral HS Interact Club**

This year the Interact Club is utilising the Committee structure. Each committee is responsible for discreet activities. The committees included

- BBQ Committee the fundraising arm of Interact with proceeds assisting Cambodia and Drought Appeal. Currently negotiating with WSC for a regular BBQ in Corbett Plaza.
- International Committee focus has been on the Cambodian Library which was damaged in a recent typhoon.
- One Girl Fun Run Committee to be held on 26<sup>th</sup> October at Glebe Park. As well as a Fun Run there will be a Gala Day with BBQ, stalls, etc. Will require Rotary help with safety, bus drivers, cooks, ushers, security etc.
- Recycling committee their goal is to implement recycling across the whole school with the aim of waste reduction, resource recovery, education. The school is also running a recycling raffle where leadership groups hand out raffle tickets to students who have been observed recycling and using bins correctly.
- Domestic Violence Committee has sourced 450 escape bags which help keep recipients clean, dry and warm. The committee is seeking any support in any shape and form.



**Interact - Milk Bottle Program** - Bowral HS Interact Club is participating ain a program of collecting plastic milk bottle lids. The lids are recycled into filament and then used in 3D printing to make prosthetic limbs for the 3<sup>rd</sup> World.

Further research has clarified that the suitable plastic is HDPE2. As Interact is attending next week's meeting it would be greatly appreciated if members could make a significant donation to the Interact Club.


