President Don introduced Rosemary Kelly





who was the speaker for the evening and her topic was the "10 Pound Pom".

Rosemary told us the story of her and her husband Frank and their decision to come to Australia. Initially Rosemary was hesitant but they both emigrated and were flown to Australia and were taken to the migrants hostel in Coogee.

The scheme was changed in 1972 to £75 but the slogan didn't change as it wasn't so catchy. She told of the conditions, the discrimination but also of the opportunities offered.

Of the people that emigrated 75% stayed and 25% returned back to their home land. Of these 25% half ended up returning to Australia. These were given the moniker of Boomerang Poms.

There were several hostels that were occupied at the time.

Rosemary named many now famous people that emigrated on this scheme. A lot were to become our famous musicians and well-known members of the community.

It was an interesting and enlightening discussion. Mary then mentioned that Rosemary was in the posh digs and she told stories of not-so-great conditions where she was placed at the age of 17 with her parents. Other Rotarians spoke up about being "imports". A hands up of the attendees was shown that out of 26 there were 11 not originally from Australia David Rees came in 1964 and by ocean liner which took a month. His best memory was that it meant no school for a month.

Announcements:
