Guest speaker - Julie Bourrigaud



David welcomed Julie as our outbound exchange student.

Julie practiced her prepared presentation which she will use while on exchange.

She outlined her goals and aspirations for exchange. After her presentation Julie was presented with her YEP Blazer.



Guest Speaker - Sarah Eddowes - A failed engineer who has completed a Masters in Fine Arts at UTS (so her dad says).



After a time lapse video showing an artist painting a large works, Sarah outlined her time in central Australia and observing Aboriginal art. Sarah was a resident for 10 weeks at the Art Centre. Ikuntji is 3.5 hrs west of Alice Springs. 60 community members are active artists. The artworks are then sold to tourists through the Shop or commissioned to galleries across Australia.

Most of the artists are currently women however in the 1970's when the Aboriginal art movement commenced it was mainly men.

Sarah produced a short video to explain the "money story" to assist artists with the explanation of the sharing of art proceeds.

Sarah became proficient at bush tucker, especially wichetty grubs. Children speak their own language at home and English at school. Some community experiences are shared including funerals and the Lutheran church where hymns are sung in the native tongue. Some of these hymns are no longer sung in Europe.



Subconsciously, Sarah gained inspiration from her experience and as produced a new style of art.









Miel Kroon thanked the fellow artist on her presentation.
