Tony Glenn International Toast and Invocation

The African Continent is such an extraordinarily and complex part of the world and for that reason this International Toast is prompted by an article yesterday in the Sydney Morning Herald concerning northern Nigeria and the kidnapping of 300 school children. The article includes a story of a mother, Rashidat Hamza, and her plight in that 5 of her 6 children were kidnapped.

There have been numerous similar kidnappings in recent weeks but they appear to be stories that have lost media appeal since the first such atrocity occurred in 2014 when Islamic extremists abducted more than 200 schoolgirls from Borno's Chibok.

There are conflicting stories as to who is behind the more recent kidnappings as no particular group has claimed involvement.

Nigeria is the most populous country in Africa exceeding 220 million people – a very complex society comprising 250 ethnic groups speaking 500 distinct languages, all identifying with a wide variety of cultures. Thus, a lot of social unrest.

Th capital is Abuja although most of us would identify with the largest city – Lagos. Abuja and surrounds has a population of about 7 million and has 40 Rotary Clubs.

District 9125 occupies the whole of Nigeria and no other country. There are 144 Clubs. Many have websites but regrettably they cannot be accessed.

The Rotary Club of Abuja Jabi Lakeside is an exception. Perhaps that is because the Immediate Past President was a woman, the current President is a woman (Aduloju Olayinka), the President Elect is a woman and the President Nominee is a woman.

The Club was chartered 16 May 2013 and has 96 members notably significantly younger than western Rotary Clubs, their website is draped with vibrant colour, full smiles of happiness and energetic activity.



This vision is the antithesis of the horrors that occur with some regularity in northern parts of Nigeria.

Please be upstanding and toast President Aduloja and the members of the Rotary Club of Abuja Jabi Lakeside.
