President Leigh presented dinner badges to recent Club members **Jeff Mann** and **Ian Donges.**




This was followed by the induction of **Barbara Humphries**

International Toast Market Tony Glenn - St Nicholas Day

St Nicholas Day is celebrated each year on December 6th the anniversary of his death in the mid 4th century. Contrary to popular belief, St Nick hasn't always resided in the North Pole, nor did he originate from Lapland in the north of Finland. The real St. Nicholas hailed from Greece, around 280 A.D. He was bishop of Myra, a small Roman town, renamed Demre since 2005 on the south coast of Turkey.



St Nicholas was a fierce and loyal individual who spent years in prison for his defence of church doctrines and is credited with several miracles -Nicholas stood up for his faith and protected those around him. Consequently, his fame lived on long after his death. Today, he is seen as the Patron Saint of Children and the bringer of gifts. Through the ages, the image of Saint Nicholas changed as he took on aspects of different deities, and as such features like the white beard and the magical power of flight began to stick.

Across much of Europe and around the world, St Nicholas (*Sinterklaas* in Dutch, or *Nikolaus* in German) is remembered annually on December 6th. On the eve of December 5th my granddaughter Cully, whose mother is German, leaves a letter out for Nikolaus, alongside shoes left by the fireplace, on the windowsill or outside her bedroom. On St. Nicholas day, her shoes should be filled with fruits, sweets and other small gifts and treats. NOT sure her parents have heard about those limitations. The ruins

of Myra remain and are quite beautiful. Situate 139 km to the east is the nearest Rotary Club -Antalya International Rotary Club, which claims to be the first English speaking Rotary club in Turkey.

The Club was established in 1980 and is situate in District 2430. President Ali Celik presides over 23 members. The Club has in recent times participated in:

- The Aitolia Marathon to create awareness on early age, involuntary child marriage; and
- Is committed to the support and assistance of Syrian refugees.
