## International Toast.

The **Great Vancouver Fire** destroyed most of the newly incorporated city of Vancouver, British Columbia, Canada, on 13 June, 1886.



It started as two land clearing fires to the west of the city. The first fire was further away from the city and was clearing land for the roundhouse of the terminus of the Canadian Pacific Railway. The second fire was clearing land to extend the city to the west.


The fires spread north-east into the city, killing at least 21 people and destroying upwards of 1,000 buildings.

Most residents escaped by fleeing to the Burrard Inlet shore or the False Creek shore. Following the recovery efforts, the city of Vancouver continued to grow. The first police force was set up, the first brick buildings were built, and the first fire engine was brought in. The Rotary Club of Vancouver was chartered on 1 April 1913 and comprises 96 members and is led by President Kendall Jessiman. The Club sponsors and has a strong presence with Rotaract and Interact. The Club has a most impressive website which certainly tells and sells its easily accessible story without having to "drill down".
