#### International Toast

Napoleon Bonaparte was born on 15 August1769 and is recognized as one of the most controversial, influential and celebrated figures in human history.

Becoming a General at age 29, Napoleon had stunning and epic military victories over his European enemies - at Austerlitz in 1805, Friedland in 1807 and Wagram in 1809. Which brings us to the epic victory that occurred on Saturday evening between the Matilda's and the Les Bleues, certainly a campaign of almost military proportions, leaving the populous of two nations exhausted in their lounge chairs, by the end of the evening.

Les Bleues play home matches at the Stade de Stadium in Saint-Denis in Paris and train at INF Clairefontaine.

There is no Rotary club in the vicinity of Saint-Denis in Paris so we visit the Rotary Club of Saint-Denis, Saint-Denis being the capital city of the Island of Reunion, which is a French Territory in the Indian Ocean (near Mauritius and Madagascar). The population is approximately 900,000 and the predominant crop and export is sugar cane and the biproducts of sugar, around which the local economy is based.

The Club was chartered in 1961 and President Rodolphe Monnerie presides over a membership of 59 and it goes without saying that they are feeling the outcome of Saturday's game.
