**Pres Leigh** thanked everyone for their attendance and closed the meeting shortly after 8.05pm.



# GUEST SPEAKER IAN LAW – Member talk "My involvement with the Environment"

Ian is the Clubs Environmental Representative and District Envoy.

Ian talked about a call he had from a neighbour at Peak Hill, who has another farm at Alec Town. Alec Town had 146mm of rain on Sunday night. His neighbour lost 1000 sheep. Ian posed the question, "What can we do?".

Ian talked about himself. He describes himself as Southern African as he lived in several SA countries. He was Born in Mauritius and moved when he was 4 to Mutare (formally Umtali in Rhodesia), then Mozambique but attended school in Rhodesia. Ian trained as a Chemical Engineer in Cape Town. Because of some alarming experiences with pollution, he retrained as a public health engineer.



In 1983 he and Sue moved to Australia where his career took off. Ian has been married for 53 years. Ian works with councils and governments in securing their water supplies into the future. Part of that is recycling water.

Ian and Sue started farming in 2003. Sue is the brains behind the farming according to Ian. Ian said he came here by chance to be near his son who moved backed to England after he had settled here, but he loves the area.

Ian asked the club members to let him know what we think are the environmental issues that are important to us. What could our club get involved in?

Tony Glenn asked the question, what is the real % of climate change? Rosemary answered plastic waste.

What other products can we use? ie wooden toothbrushes.

Don Graham, Cubby Station water use.

Luciano, reminisced about his father's farm and the difficulties that existed in the 40's and 50's. Leigh asked the club if we are interested in introducing a session on the environment into the calendar rather than a guest speaker. The answer was yes. Leigh will organise it.
