Today is the National Day of Norway commemorating the declaration of the Constitution in 1814 which maintained the independence of Norway from Sweden after the defeat of Napoleon the first time around.

Norway was the land of the Vikings for a thousand years of the middle ages and by the 14th Century AD was united with Sweden, Denmark and part of Finland in various combinations of kingdoms. After 1814 Norway maintained its separate identity under one King with Sweden.

Constitution Day is celebrated across the Country and is marked as Russ Day by graduating high school students with street marches and other naughtiness.

Norway has a population of 5.1 million and borders Sweden along its eastern frontier and Finland and Russia in the far north.

It has a very high standard of living and very high degree of equality of wealth distribution based largely on North Sea oil.

The oil industry is centred on Stavanger, a port city and suburban area of some 690 000 people on the south west coast.

The Stavanger International Rotary Club was chartered in 1986 in District 2250 and although it has only 15 members it is very active in fund raising and international projects with a golf day planned for the end of this month. Earlier this year they held a charity walk in and around the city.

They partner with Clubs in India and Sri Lanka to deliver vaccination and paediatric prosthetics to children in those countries.

They exchange students with District 9450 in Perth under the Rotary Global Youth Exchange Program. The President is Aud Retsby.



Barriers to Membership – Part 2

In lieu of a guest speaker, members were invited to comment on barriers to joining Rotary. Below is a summary of comments made.

Cost

- Cost of meals is relatively low. Some clubs pay \$40 per head.
- Annual costs are a possible barrier (Ed: Rotary subscriptions etc are \$240 ish next year).
- Options to catering eat or not eat, make own arrangements for meal and have shorter meeting.
- Other clubs where this is an option seems to then have 2 groups of members.
- RDU subscription alternative is to subscribe to "The Rotarian" digital subscription. Currently \$16USD. If the club chose this option member subs would reduce.

Meeting frequency

- As attendance is no longer recorded members are not obliged to attend each week
- Keep weekly meetings with options open
- Fortnightly meetings creates an air of anticipation and keenness
- Sydney CBD Rotary trialed fortnightly meetings with great success
- Alternative venues are an option for meetings
