

PP Rosemary read the International Toast, this week to the Rotary Club of Gibraltar.

Gibraltar was captured by an Anglo-Dutch force from Spain during the War of Spanish Succession in 1704 and ceded to Great Britain in 1713 which has retained it ever since.

During the Second World War it was a key naval base in controlling access through the Straits of Gibraltar to the Mediterranean Sea with a vital role in supplying Malta when it was under siege.

Spain still claims it as their territory but the inhabitants have repeatedly voted to remain a part of the United Kingdom.

The **Rotary Club of Gibraltar** was chartered in 1966 in District 1120 with 80 Clubs in Kent and East Essex.

President Adrian Tavares leads 38 Members whose major fund raising activity is a monthly car boot sale. They are also promoting an opera concert in November.

They have formed an association with **Rotary Clubs in Tangier and Cueta** in District 9010 on the north coast of Morocco known as the **Clubs of the Strait** Project which has begun renovating 5 primary schools in those cities.

This is a great example of Rotary's ability to work together across different territories and cultures to improve educational opportunities for the next generation. PP Rod added his welcome back;

Brian Pattinson reported on the latest from Dr Roly Biggs' philanthropy, this time with undergraduate scholarships for young disabled adults.

Gerry's "Art in the Arcade" project will be opened by Ben Quilty, now on Thursday 26/10 at 4-4.30 with pizza and most likely "a few drinks at a local" later.

In closing: David's reminders: next week, Chris Neal on Nepal....and next Tuesday is End Polio Day so please, wear a T-shirt if you have one?


