International Toast: Rose Conley

Ireland's Dominion status was terminated with the passage of the Republic of Ireland Act 1948, which came into force on 18 April 1949 and declared that the state was a republic.

Dublin is the capital of the Republic where 2.1 million of the 5.13million population reside in the Greater Dublin Area.

The Rotary Club of Dublin was chartered on 1 May 1913 and is the first Rotary Club chartered outside North America. The President is David Hook and there are 46 members currently.

The Club's participates in a diverse range of projects including:

- An Annual Rubber Duck Race in one of Dublin's rivers with proceeds going to End Polio Now.
- They supply and cook Christmas Dinner for a local Senior Citizens Centre.
- They source and deliver Christmas Trees to 30 Dublin institutions.
- They support Alice Leahy Trust in assisting homeless people in Dublin.

- With ten other European Rotary Clubs, they come together annually over a weekend to award a prize of €12,100 to a person under the age of 35 in an arts or science discipline associated with Leonardo da Vinci.
- An annual BBQ to raise funds for a secondary school in Zambia that gives educational opportunities to children orphaned by AIDS.
