In an exhibition of the extreme weather events occurring more frequently because of climate change, last week there were 7 simultaneous typhoon and hurricane systems across the north Pacific and Atlantic Oceans.Two of them continue to drop heavy rain with Florence still affecting the US east coast.

Typhoon Mangkhut caused great damage and flooding across the Philippines last week, damaged Hong Kong on the weekend and continues as a rain depression into southern China. At least 65 people are reported to have died during this storm but the number is almost certainly much higher.

Kowloon is one of the poorer suburbs of Hong Kong located on a peninsula exposed to Victoria Harbour and took the full force of the winds. It is home to 2.1 million of Hong Kong's 7.4 million population.

It was ceded to the UK by the Qing Emporer in 1860 after the Second Opium War and was part of the 99 year lease with the New Territories in 1898. Now it is in China's Special Administrative Zone.

There are 69 Clubs in Hong Kong in District 3450 where the Rotary Club of Kowloon Tong was

Chartered in 2009.

It has 23 Members led by President Portia Ho. They will be hard at work with other Rotarians assisting in the recovery from the storms.

Member Talk – Trevor Fair

Men's brains v women's brains

Disclaimer – These are my personal observations and there is no intent to offend anyone. I hope everyone appreciates the presentation in the humorous vane it is attempting to be. Don 's jobs have been a Farmer and a Lawyer.
