Nigeria was a colony of Britain from the beginning of the 19th Century when it was a centre for the slave trade to the Americas.

It achieved independence from the UK on 1st October, 1960 and became the Federal Republic of Nigeria on 1st October, 1963 when the 36 states federated. It remains a Member of the Commonwealth with its own President as Head of State.

Today Nigeria has a population of 186 million, 90 million of whom are under 18.

Port Harcourt is the capital of Rivers State and is located on the Niger River delta in the south of the country on the Gulf of Guinea coast. It has a population of 1.9 million.

There are 363 Rotary Clubs in 4 districts in Nigeria and the newest of them is the Rotary Club of Port Harcourt New City which was Chartered in District 9141 earlier this year.

One of their initial projects is to support *End Polio Now* in the program to eradicate the last vestiges of polio from this, one of the last three countries still reporting cases.

President Ogechi Eze-Ochulor leads 20 brand new Rotarians as they set about doing good in their community.
