Bob welcomed back Ian Langford after his recent surgeries.

Bob together with 2 other members attended the Wingecarribee Volunteer Expo at the Bowral Town Hal earlier today. There were 16 volunteer groups. Our club showcased our Shelterbag community project, our involvement in Tulip Time, Bong Bong Races, and Cycle Classic. He mentioned how few people know what we actually do as a Club. Something we need to correct.

Robbie and David Rees again represented us at "Fit 4 Life" program conducted at Bowral High School joining teachers, NSW Police and PCYC. Robbie has agreed to organize a roster to continue the program.

Robert de Jongh and his MUNA committee reported that the plans are finalized for preparation on Friday and the event this Saturday commencing 8 am at Moss Vale Chambers. He would appreciate volunteers to help set-up this Friday. Rob explained the history of Muna. There are 35 students competing and the Mayor is opening it.

Bob invited Ian Langford to report on the Science and Engineering Challenge which commences next Monday and Tuesday 26th and 27th May at the Mittagong RSL. There are 7 high schools and 18 public schools participating. He thanked Rod and Will for their help with the roster in his absence.

Bob invited Rosemary Kelly to introduce the guest speaker Lynn Wickenden.



Lynn has been in Nursing for 42 years, 31 of those have been at Bowral Hospital and 20 years of that was spent in ED. For that Lynn, you deserve a medal.

Lynn has had many different roles over the years which I am sure she will tell us all about.

We have so many wonderful nurses working so hard in our local hospitals. When we were looking through the applicants our choice was made easier in selecting Lynn because she has gone beyond her duties as a nurse. In Rotary we have a four way test and one of those is DUTY ABOVE SELF. Lynn has certainly achieved that so please welcome Lynn as our 2024 Nurse of the year.

Bob presented the award to Lynn. Sue Miller gave her a lovely bunch of flowers.

Lynn commenced her speech by saying that she moved down to Bowral when her son was one. Her partner Marlene is a paramedic.

She started working as a casual nurse, working in different departments and moved through the ranks.

She found her niche in the ED which is where she worked for 20 years. "Bowral Hospital is a fantastic place to work. Nurses get a lot of experience at Bowral working in different areas of the hospital. They worked with the local GPS and were allowed to give antibiotics, order x rays etc. They would only wake the Doctor on duty if needed. They learnt a lot of skills and had a great camaraderie with the physios and other staff. The Head of the hospital at the time signed off nurses to do extra skills. When nurses were assigned to Bowral Hospital from Liverpool, they didn't have the experience like the local nurses. Bowral nurses worked more like a community. Paramedics would stay and help if needed". Lynn learnt how to "put out spot fires" if required.

Lynn thanked everyone and said the donation of \$2000 is going towards the reintroduction of pet therapy which is what they had before Covid hit. They had a dog who both patients and staff loved to have around.

Bob thanked Lynn for her speech.

Further comments from Bob were:

Steve Escott getting the FIRST Aid Course going.

On the 2nd and 3rd August, there is a Youth Mental Health First Aid Course.

Disability Sports Australia held an inclusive day of activities at Frensham School. He, Robbie and Mary attended. This program is funded by the Federal Government.

Defibrillator training is to be organized.


At the Volunteer Expo on Tuesday. Our shelterbag display and Kevin the homeless dummy attracted a lot
