This Friday is officially the first day of the year when it is acceptable to wear Bermuda shorts to work in Bermuda. It is also the first day when boats are allowed to go on the water.

Yes, at last it is Bermuda Day and it is a public holiday in the largest remaining British Overseas Territory and as such, while it has its own parliament and government, it is still a dependency of Britain. It is located about 1200km south west of New York in the Atlantic.

Bermuda was discovered by a Spanish sailor, Juan de Bermúdez in 1505 but was not settled. In 1609 it was actually terra nullius with no indigenous inhabitants like some other places when it was claimed and occupied by Britain and administered from Virginia.

There are some 71,000 Bermudans whose main economic exports are insurance, re-insurance and tourism. Naturally they have a high per capita income and live very well.

The Rotary Club of St. Georges, the most north easterly island of the group, was Chartered in District 7230 in 1951. There are only 4 Clubs in Bermuda, the other 39 in the District are in New York.
