Rob de Jonge gave the Invocation and International Toast.

The political divide between Ukraine and Russia runs deep. In 2018 Western and Ukrainian officials raised alarm about a Russian military build-up near Ukraine, where Russian-backed separatists had been fighting Ukraine's Western-allied forces since 2014. The Russian moves brought concern regarding a Russian invasion of Ukraine. A claim which was rejected at the time by Moscow. As we all know now, that rejection was false and Russia is again waging a war against Ukraine.

Today is Holodomor Memorial Day. Holodomor translates from Ukrainian as 'death by hunger'. It refers to a man-made famine perpetrated by the Stalinist Communist Party of the USSR in 1932 and 1933 which caused the starvation of more than 7,000,000 men, women and children in Ukraine.

This occurred as a consequence of the resistance of the Ukrainian Nation to Russian occupation and subsequent forced collectivisation of agricultural production.

Traditionally, on this day Ukrainians attend memorial services, put up symbolic vessels of grain and light candles in memory of the victims of the Holodomor.

This event has been recognised worldwide as probably the worst ever example of ethnic cleansing, eclipsing even the Jewish Holocaust, although most people have never even heard of this tragic event.

In 1985, John Howard , who was then leader of the opposition, unveiled a monument to the victims of the Holodomor of 1932-1933 in Ukraine near the Ukrainian Orthodox Church in Canberra.

The Rotary Club of Kyiv Community is one of 76 Rotary clubs in District 2232 which covers all clubs in Ukraine. It is a new club having been chartered on 30 January 2024. The Club is led by President Oleksandr Kulinchenko and has 25 members.

Would you please be upstanding and raise a toast in support of Ukraine, the Rotary Club of Kyiv Community and its President Oleksandr Kulinchenko.



Bob then introduced Leigh Robinson who gave a presentation on Rotary Foundation.

Main points of interest are:

Rotary own this charity. It is an effective and wellmanaged charitable organization.

It has achieved a 4 star rating from Charity Watch Navigator. An A+ rating from Charity Watch On behalf of Rotary Club members who do good in the world.

Rotary's main goals are to improve education quality, help Rotary Club Districts to work together to perform meaningful sustainable services.

Sustainable projects are clean water, making medicines available and improving education.

Some examples of projects being done are eradication of polio, improving sanitization in Papua New Guinea, supplying food to Guatemola, training farmers in Taiwan, disease prevention etc

There are 7 main areas of focus:

- Literacy,
- Sanitation,
- Safe water
- Management of water resources
- Identifying long term funding
- Expanding water systems
- Implement rainwater harvesting systems

Other goals are disease prevention and treatment, eradication of polio, vaccinations, training in health education, access and education to contraception, promotion of good nutrition, eliminate HIV transmission, supply birthing kits, economic development including mobile banking, providing equipment to co-operatives, environment protection which includes tree planting. Conflict resolution, peace building. Donating books and equipment to schools in 3rd world countries

There are TFE Australia based projects like Purple House (kidney disease) There are district and global grants. Working with clubs in other countries, Direct donations eg Centurian donations and creating an endowment in your will. Donations to the Rotary Foundation for the Paul Harris Fellowship awards for individual service.

Bob Miller thanked Leigh for his presentation on what the Foundation does.
