Club Report

Pres Leigh gave his report for the year 2022-23.

This Rotary year has proven to be more fortunate than previous years, there has not been a COVID lockdown. The removal of lockdown conditions simplified the role of the President as all meetings were able to be held face-to-face. I acknowledge the difficulties that my preceding Presidents were subjected to in being unable to meet with members in person and to hold normal community events. Except for 3 weather cancelled functions, all other planned outdoors events were able to be held unhindered. The coming year promises to be one where ALL events are expected to proceed unhindered.

As a long serving Rotary Club, members have a right to be proud of the service longevity of Bowral-Mittagong Rotarians. Currently there are three members with more than 40 years of service (Rod Aistrope, Dominic Williams & Brian Pattinson). There are two Honorary members with similar lengths of service (Ken Adams & Neil Mulveney) and a further four current members having served very close to 40 years (Tony Glenn, Lynton Kettle, Jim Gasson & Darryl Flegg). Each of these Rotarians are typical of the high standard of service provided to local, regional and international communities. Special mention is made of the length and intensity of service of Brian Pattinson who has served Rotary and numerous communities, local, national and international, for more than 50 years.

The Club's appreciation extends to the venues that have supported our dinner meetings throughout the year: Kookabar Café, Bowral Bowling Club, Annesley Café and The Hermitage. Each of these venues have provided excellent meals and service, sometimes under duress due to unexpected increase in attendees.

During this Rotary Year fundraising was able to proceed virtually unhindered and enabled us to make cash donations in excess of \$57,000 including support given locally. Flood relief donations were made through the Rotary Clubs of Windsor and Parkes and through ShelterBox for Turkiye. Local assistance included the purchase of a new freezer for the kitchen at the Bowral Uniting Church and an insulin pump for a critical diabetes sufferer from Berrima. During the year, our volunteers provided nearly 2,000 hours in

community service plus well in excess of 500 hours of preparation and follow up hours for at least 32 community events and fundraising activities. If converted to real dollars this equates to a further contribution in the order of \$87,500 to our community. Further detail on each of our activities are included in the following Committee Chair reports.

There were 2 Club Assemblies held during the year. These assemblies are an opportunity for members to voice their opinion on how the Club is run and operates. Members discussed issues ranging from venues to how the Invocation is presented. A Certified copy of the Original Club Charter was obtained through the local RI office and is now available for presentation at all Club meetings.

The Rotary Foundation was well supported, and the Club received a Level 1 Certificate for donations to the Foundation.

I have heartily enjoyed this term as President and express my deepest thanks for the advice and support of the Board and of the Club members throughout the year. Without such support any President is not able to effectively manage their role.

The job of being the wife or partner of a Rotary President is so important in supporting the President. As such I heartily thank my wife Stephanie, for her continuing support and love. Pres Leigh asked Brian Pattinson to change over the Rotary Banner to the new one for 23-24. CREATING HOPE IN THE WORLD.

Pres Leigh handed over to Don Graham. And wished a successful year.



In Rotary we are at a point where we are moving from a year of Imagining Rotary to a year of creating Hope in the World. Don, the role that you have accepted can be a demanding but rewarding one.
