## **International Toast**

The Singapore Army is currently engaged in exercises at Shoalwater Bay near Rockhampton and since we have never had an International Toast to Singapore today is an occasion when we can celebrate our SEATO Treaty partnership.

Singapore also has permanent air force units based at Pearce in Western Australia and at Oakey Army Aviation Base in Queensland.

The Lion City is the world's only island city state. It was colonised by Britain in 1819 and finally achieved independence in 1963 when it became part of Malaysia. It was expelled in September, 1965.

Today there are 5.5 million inhabitants and the population density is 7 700 people per square kilometre and is the business hub of South East Asia.

The name Changi is mostly known to Australians as the notorious Japanese War Prison and nowadays as the Airport for Singapore at the east end of the main island.

The Rotary Club of Changi was chartered in 1988 and has 36 Members led by President Lik-Khui Ho. It is in District 3310 which also covers Brunei and Malaysia

The Club supports the poor of the Changi area and the End Polio Now campaign.
