Tahiti is the main island of the Society Islands Archipelago located in the middle of the Pacific Ocean which is a part of French Polynesia, a part of France.

It was occupied from West Polynesia in about 200 BC and first discovered by Europeans in 1606. Captain Cook made his first trip to Tahiti to view the transit of Venus across the sun and went on his way to discover New Zealand and the east coast of Australia.

Tahiti now has a population of 190 000 and the Capital, Papeete has 26 000 people.

Naturally enough the economy is based on tourism, much of it from France including support for the budget, black pearls and tropical fruits.

The Chinese haven't had much to do with Tahiti until the Easter weekend when the islands were almost hit by a Chinese tourist bus named Tiangong 1, disguised as a space station re-entered the atmosphere over the eastern Pacific. Most of it burned up but the last bits landed somewhere just north west of the island.

So to celebrate the good luck of the Tahitians, tonight our International Toast will be to the **Rotary Club of Papeete**.

The Club was Chartered in 1959 in District 9920 and has 30 Members led by **President Mourad Mikou**.
