# International Toast - Trevor Fair

The United Nations has adopted today as International Jazz Day.

Since 2011 famous jazz pianist Herbie Hancock has been the UNESCO Goodwill Ambassador for Intercultural Dialogue and started International Jazz Day celebrations around the world on this day in 2012.

The first year Paris, New Orleans and New York held concerts and since then Istanbul, Osaka, Paris again, Washington, Havana, St. Petersburg and this year Sydney have been the host cities.

Herbie Hancock is in town and giving a master class at the Opera House this week. He will be back for the Vivid Festival and a national tour in June.

New Orleans is widely recognised as the heart and soul of jazz.

The city is often hit by hurricanes and was badly damaged by Katrina in 2005. It is still in recovery with its population of 400 000 still 55 000 less than before the cyclone. The TV series *Tremé*, set in a city suburb showed life in recovery set against a jazz background.

The Rotary Club of Mid-City New Orleans was Chartered in District 6840 in 2015 and deals with the local difficulties of life supporting domestic violence and sexual assault victims.

President Adelle Bergman and her 35 Members raise funds for this work with a progressive poker crawl on bikes visiting 5 pubs in town, collecting donations and one playing card each at each pub. The participant with the best poker hand wins a prize and the Club keeps the money.

### **Guest Speaker - Steve Matthews**



Steve was born in UK and has had a career in banking and finance.

Children's Literature is a passion. "The Skinny Girl" is his first in adult literature.

Diane and himself were invited to go to India where they had some of his books in the library. Inspired home to write a book for translation into Hindi. Recently became apparent that a friend was in an abusive relationship. Most murders occur either 2 weeks before or 2 weeks after the female plans to leaves the relationship.

After researching 800 pages of documents came away with a manuscript.

A Homicide victims support group has been set up in conjunction with White Ribbon and NSW Police. Every 2 minutes Police receive a call from a woman seeking help concerning domestic violence.

For every 4 women in domestic violence situation there is 1 man.

The book "The Skinny Girl" is based on facts, however fictionised to cover identities of characters.

Some alarming statistics include 2017 53 died from abusive relationships. In 2018 68 women died.

There are currently 250 women's refuges in Australia, White Ribbon state they need 2500. There also needs to be better co-ordination between the agencies to ensure effective and efficient services are provided.

Where Government funds are used, they seek to control of the activities which does not always mean the best outcomes are achieved as politics comes into play.

Police now record with digital cameras when they enter a home and this information can be used in Court. Hospitals have forensic Drs who also provide evidence. This will hopefully lead to increased convictions and therefore less incidents in the futire.

A Domestic Violence Abuser Register is held by Police. If someone is considering entering a relationship they are able to contact Police to see whether the potential partner has any history of domestic violence.

The 2 major triggers for domestic violence include

- 1. Alcohol
- 2. Gambling
- 3. Finance

A 3% increase in interest rates will cause a dramatic increase in domestic violence.

It is essential to educate children early in an attempt to prevent the next generation of abusers.

Had 4 offers to publish the book, 2 form Australia. Decided to use an independent Australian Publisher. Normally the book is written by the victim, however this book is written with all warts and all. '

All royalties goes to the charities. Website has donation details.

People always have a choice, even as children. Every morning everyone has a choice. No person asks to be abused, thumped, etc.
