Today is Throne Day, the national day of the Kingdom of Morocco which celebrates the ascension to the throne of King Mohamed VI in 1999.

Morocco is located along the north western coast of Africa. It was a Roman Province and its kingdom was re-established in 788, overrun by the Islamic expansion of the early 8th Century but retained its culture within the caliphate by adopting Islam, following the laws and paying taxes. It was occupied for centuries by France and Spain until it regained its independence in 1956.

Rotary was first established in Morocco in 1930 and there are now 52 Clubs of which 20 are in the largest city, Casablanca. Including its metropolitan area it has 6½ million of the nation's total population of 35 million.

The Rotary Club of Casablanca International is an English speaking Club Chartered in 2012 and has 15 Members.

Its new President is Maha Hmeid. Her Members distribute Ramadan food parcels to needy families as one of the Club's community projects.

It is twinned with the Rotary Club of Istanbul as a gesture of international unity.

Suicide Awareness Course

Members are invited to attend a Suicide Awareness Course at the Bowral Bowling Club on Wednesday the 21st of August. The course will be presented by Suzanne Freund (Dip Adult Ed., TAE, Diploma in Counselling) who is an accredited trainer in Mental Health First Aid, Youth Mental Health First Aid, in ASIST (Applied Suicide Intervention Skills Training) and Lifeforce Suicide

Prevention Training.

This activity is a joint venture between the Rotary Clubs of Berrima District, Bowral/Mittagong and Moss Vale as it has wide relevance in our Southern Highlands community.
