For a thousand years Denmark was a kingdom, both in its own right and as part of kingdoms including Sweden and Norway. On 5th June, 1849 it became a Constitutional Monarchy on its own while still including Greenland, Iceland and the Faroe Islands. Iceland took its independence in 1944.

Denmark has 5.8 million people and will soon be ruled by an Australian when Princess Mary of Hobart becomes Queen.
