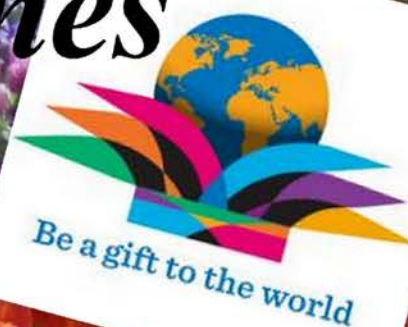

Last Saturday we celebrated our freedom as a nation with a barbecue for the exhausted citizens by serving them democracy sausage on an electoral roll to strengthen them on their way in to do their duty and help them recover on their way out of the Polling Place in Bowral.

The home of democracy was Greece where the city state of Athens established direct voting on legislation by a narrow category of electors in 508 BC.

Athens is now a city of 3.8 million people but it has been ravaged by its financial crises and overrun by refugees from the middle east which is only a short distance away.

Omonia Square was the vibrant heart of the city when the **Rotary Club of Athinai-Omonia** was Chartered in 2002 in District 2470.

The Square is now a desolate and run down area with homeless people, violence and drug dealing rife but the Club, though small with only 13 Members is still active and serving the community.

The Club combined with another Athens Rotary Club over the last three years to donate a full dental clinic to a village on an island in the north west of Greece.

The new leader of the Rotary Club of Athinai-Omonia for 2016/17 is President Argiris Anastassatos.
