International Toast – Robert deJongh

In September last year our International toast was to the Rotary Club of Guatemala North in recognition of their Independence Day.

President David sent our condolences for the damage and lives lost in the country from a severe earthquake and cyclone which had struck within days of each other and received an email of appreciation from the President of the Club.

You will be aware that the Volcán del Fuego (Volcano of Fire) on the west side of the mountainous spine of Central America has erupted resulting in at least 62 dead, 300 injured and 2000 people missing so far.

Guatemala was the heart of the Mayan civilisation which collapsed from drought and famine around 900 AD. The many volcanoes along the tectonic plate fault line must have been a big part of their religion. There have been over 60 eruptions since the Spanish colonised the land in the early 16th Century and Fuego is always active.

The volcano is only 40km from the Capital, Guatemala City but fortunately the population of 2.9 million is safe from this eruption.

The Rotary Club of Guatemala City was Chartered in District 4250 in 1925 and its President, Mario Lopez leads 47 Members.

They have been active in hands-on projects, re-roofing a school near the city and distributing wheel chairs for people with disabilities. They are 100% Paul Harris Fellows. The Club will be busy in helping those affected by the eruption of the Volcano of Fire over the coming months.
