The **Republic of Niger** is a landlocked country in the north of Africa. It is surrounded by Nigeria and Benin to the south, Burkina Faso to the west, Mali and Algeria to the north and Chad to the west.



Its 1.27 million square kilometres is 80% Sahara Desert with the River Niger running through the west of the land. It is home to 24 million people of low average income and poor living standards.

Its economy was underpinned by uranium mining which has declined and now is mostly subsistence farming. Life is not easy.

The area has had human and prehistoric habitation for 200 000 years and was wetter and more fertile until around 6000 years ago when it started drying out.

It was ruled and had its own empires and kingdoms over time until European colonisation from the 17th Century. In 1885, to stop fighting over territory the European powers met at the Berlin Conference and divided up the continent into spheres of influence and the French got the top end of Africa.

Under President de Gaulle power was devolved to the colonies which became members of the French Union and on 18th December, 1958 Niger declared itself a Republic. **Next week it will celebrate its Independence Day.**

The Capital of Niger is **Niamey**, a city of just over a million people. There are 6 Rotary Clubs in Niger three of which have been Chartered in the last 2 years.

The oldest is the **Rotary Club of Niamey** which was Chartered in District 9102 in 1967. It has 25 Members led by **President Salamatou Gerard**.

Her Club has continued a long term project to provide tables and bench seats, toilet facilities and clean water to local schools in partnership with overseas Clubs.
