International Toast - Brian Ritson

The small Mediterranean island of Cyprus, located 75km south of Turkey and 100km west of Lebanon.

Being in a highly strategic location for trade and empire it has been occupied over time by the Assyrians, Egyptians, Persians, the Greeks including Alexander The Great, the Romans and others.

It was controlled by the British from 1878 with over 77% of the population of Greek heritage and 18% Turkish. From the early '50s the Turkish Cypriot community started agitating for independence but when it came in 1960 it was as a single Cyprus Republic dominated by the majority Greek Cypriots.

Inter-communal violence escalated and the United Nations established a peace keeping force in 1964 but in 1974 Turkey invaded and the island was partitioned.

UN Peace Keepers have been there ever since including an Australian Police detachment continuously since 1964. NSW Police were among the first contingent, coming under fire from Turkish Cypriot and Turkish forces.

Things have settled down now and there are attempts to reunite the country.

The Rotary Club of Nicosia was chartered in 1938 in District 2452 which has 78 Clubs spread over 9 countries stretching from Armenia and Georgia in the north east to Bahrain in the south east, Sudan in the south and Jordan in the middle.

President Nick Paraskeva leads 66 Members who will hold a major fund raising party later this month with funds going towards End Polio Now and a reforestation project run by their Rotaract Club.

Rob Uhl introduced guest speaker Rod Smith.

Superintendent Rod Smith



Rod has been a friend of Rotary since his time in Wagga Wagga. His current posting is as Superintendent of Monaro command which has had 2 recent winners of the Police of the Year Award.

The Monaro Command covers the lower area of the state including Delegate, snowy mountains etc. The Police Alpine Unit consists of a team of 10 and training includes 5 day cross country skiing, ski-doos etc. Another challenge is the ACT - NSW border and negotiating with the AFP.

Rod has spoken to RYLA attendees and believes it is difficult to engage with young people. Some young people lack the confidence and trust to communicate with Police. Community engagement with young people is better utilizing face to face communication and not social media. Domestic violence policing has changed. Police now have the power to decide on action and not relying on the victim giving approval to intervene. Police carry cameras to incidents, and this evidence can be used in court. Guilty pleas have increased with this tool.

Alcohol issues are also being policed more closely. While ice is not an epidemic any one person on ice is an issue. It is very likely that one use of ice is sufficient to get hooked.
