In August, 2014 Past President Ray Coulton led a team of 10 Members of this Club on a RAWCS project to refurbish and improve the Vaotu'u Free Wesleyan Primary School in Tonga.



Needless to say, the project was an enormous success and the Club was awarded a District Commendation by District Governor Rowley Tompsett.

We had an undertaking that the work which we did would be maintained by the Rotary Club of Nuku'alofa, the only Club in Tonga and we trust that it was so.

GoogleEarth images from May last year on your tables show that the work we did was still in good condition then.

Fortunately the ground level of the school is 16 metres above sea level and it is a kilometre in on the south west side of the main island Tongatapu.

When the Hunga Tonga Volcano, 65km north of Tongatapu exploded on 15th January the resulting tsunami, which was only 1.2 metres high when it reached the island would not have affected the school.

Doubtless the ash fallout will have covered everything so disruption must have occurred but we can be certain that the school will continue on and classes will resume soon.

The Rotary Club of Nuku'alofa was Chartered in 1968 in District 9920 which covers 52 Clubs in 8 countries from American Samoa and Kiribati in the east, Fiji and the Cook Islands in the north down to Auckland in New Zealand.

Guest Speaker - Tina McPherson

Tina played one test and five one day internationals for Australia's national women's cricket team. She holds the record for the first woman to get five wickets on WODI debut, and the first to take five-for in a WODI.



In the 18th Century females played many sports including cricket.

In the 19th C Martha Grace coached her 5 sons, including WG Grace.

Overarm bowling was invented by women who could not bowl underarm as their arm was caught in the hooped shirts.



In 1886 sometimes more than 1000 onlookers would attend and watch English women's cricket matches.

Tina's father used to drive her to Sydney from Cowra each weekend to play cricket. Her father was a Sydney first grader.

Tina's first job was at Coles, and stayed there for 35years. Commenced in Hornsby, then Goulburn, Sydney.

Played juniors 1967-69, then seniors.

Was selected in the Australian probables side, and selected for the World Cup in 1973. Had to pay everything themselves. \$898 for the airfare and needed two jobs to fund the trip.



Practiced at Lords, and were the first females allowed into the Long Room. The tournament went for 3 months, and was beaten in the final by England.

5 wickets for 14 possibly at Headingly. Against England. with the best bowling record.

After finishing cricket in Sydney went back to Bowral, where she was asked to play with Robertson Burrawang Cricket.
