#### Robert and Tony Guest Speakers with "Member Stories"

#### 1. Robert DeJongh – How I lived to tell the Tale



Robert gave us a humorous, chronological account of his many brushes with near disaster. (No cat could compete!)

From a two-year-old playing with a funnel-web to his latest under-water encounter with a Great White, Robert took us through close calls with various boating and "parachuting" accidents before he was ten, to a student pram race in the middle of William St traffic, to close calls with mine blasting, a crocodile, and another diving scare. That was ten! No 'cat' can compete with that!

#### 2. Tony Glenn – "How do I compete with That?!"



Tony gave us an interesting and at times remarkable insight into a period of his business life with one, and later two, of the Southern Highlands well known, successful, entrepreneurs, - Gil Downes and David Wills.

In 1995, Gill was running a number of Shell Service Stations at the time and was asked by Shell to restructure the retail of petrol to all their outlets. Tony joined Gil as Legal Counsel and Financial Controller.

The brief with Shell was,

- a. To take control of the retail service stations throughout NSW, ACT in Adelaide and Brisbane. Having achieved that, the two were surprised by Shell when the whole retail service station network was then contracted to Coles.
- b. To restructure the wholesale distribution network throughout Australia there were 450 wholesale distributors costing Shell a lot of money! Those were ultimately acquired and taken back inhouse by Shell.

Tony then went on to describe how Gil Downes, and his business partner David Wills, acquired the properties and built up the hardware business of Mittagong Home Hardware, later to sell that to Woolworths. A story of small beginnings leading to great success and wealth.
