Uganda was administered with Kenya and Tanganyika by the British East Africa Company from 1888.

The Republic of Uganda became independent from the United Kingdom on 9th October, 1962 and to honour its Independence Day today our International Toast this evening is to the Rotary Club of Kabale.

Current Ugandan President Museveni was elected in 1986. The country has been stable during his leadership but has been involved in a number of conflicts particularly with its neighbour to the west, the Democratic Republic of the Congo in that time.

Its other neighbours are South Sudan to the north, Kenya to the east, Rwanda and Tanzania in the south with Lake Victoria to the south east. Kabale is a city close to the Rwanda border. It has a population of 50 000.

The Rotary Club of Kabale in District 9211 was Chartered in 1984.

While next week we will host our District Governor Margaret Hassall, two weeks ago Kabala hosted SEVEN District Governors! To prove that bravery they also undertook gorilla tracking and a boat ride on Uganda's deepest lake as fund raisers last month and held a Cancer Run in August.

The Club's 20 members are led by President John Agaba.

From April 2017 to March 2018 ninety- three cases of domestic abuse have been reported in our local area.

#### He then dies of polio.


