International Toast



Wilbur and Orville Wright were American inventors and pioneers of aviation with the brothers achieving the world's first first flight with a powered aircraft.

On December 17,1903 they succeeded in the first free controlled flight in a power driven heavier than air aeroplane. Wilbur flew

their aircraft for 59 seconds over a distance of 852 feet.



They surpassed their own milestone two years later when they built and flew that first practical airplane known as the 'Kitty Hawk'. The craft was an extremely strong structure with wing spars of spruce and shaped pieces of ash and surfaces covered with muslin cloth.

The flyer was propelled by a 4 cylinder, gasoline engine developing 12.5 HP linked through a chain drive transmission to twin counter rotating propellers turning at 348 RPM.

Finding that their success was not appreciated in their own country the brothers in 1909 accompanied by their sister Katherine moved to Europe where they became celebrities.

The Wright's work inspired successful aircraft designs by others and the lead up to WW1 saw further accelerated the expansion of innovation and manufacturing. An example being the Fokker plant in Germany produced 3,300 fighter planes in the first half of 1918.

The Rotary Club of Dayton, Ohio was chartered as the 47th club of Rotary International on June 1913 and with the Club now111 years old, has witnessed so many thing in society changing over the course of its existence.

Orville Wright was an early member of the Club of Dayton with a few Dayton members having witnessed the Wright's first flight in 1903 and then the moon landings some 65 years' later.

The Rotary Club of Dayton was once a business only club that mirrored Paul Harris thinking:

Businessmen learning about one another's business, doing business with each other based upon a foundation of trust.

Today, to survive the Club must be representative our surroundings focussing upon building productive relationships and serving our community. We are individuals of different genders and different backgrounds but remain resilient to our purpose.

I ask you to be upstanding to toast the Rotary Club of Dayton, Ohio.

Acting President Don outlined the program for the evening to include induction of a new member and the award of a Paul Harris Fellowship.
